Push and pull: demonstrate these actions using the shopping trolley. In and out: use these words when putting food in the trolley and taking it out of the trolley to pay.



First and last: use these positional words while waiting in the queue.

Shopping

Top, middle and bottom: when getting cans from the shelves, talk about their position on the shelves.



Cold: discuss the meaning of this word when getting food from the fridges and the freezers.

On these activity sheets are everyday situations which you are likely to encounter with your child. Have a look at the example situations and think about how you could model and talk about basic concepts while completing the activities.



Fruit and vegetable categories: talk about whether a food is a fruit or a vegetable.

**Eat and drink** verbs: think about words such as, chew, munch etc.







## **Developing Basic Concepts in Everyday Situations**











Dirty and clean: use these words to compare the laundry before and after the wash.

**Clothing:** Discuss the different names given to items of clothing and whether they are suitable for wearing in hot or cold weather.

Auditory memory and listening skills: create opportunities to develop skills, e.g. ask your child to put the socks, T-shirt and jumper in the washing

machine in that order. Laundry

Same and different: use this comparative language when pairing up socks.

Colour vocabulary: describe the colours of the clothes and other items.

Full and empty: discuss how the washing machine is full after you put in the clothes and empty when you have taken them out to dry.

> Open and closed: demonstrate opening and closing the door of the washing machine.

Long and short: use these words when pairing up socks.

> Wet and dry: Compare the laundry before and after the wash.
