What does a SENCo do?

The SEN Co-ordinator (SENCo), in collaboration with the head teacher and governing body, plays a key role in determining the strategic development of the SEN policy and provision in the school in order to raise the achievement of children with SEN. The SENCo, who is a qualified teacher, takes day-to-day responsibility for the provision made for individual children with SEN, working closely with staff, parents and carers and other agencies.

The SENCo also provides related professional guidance to colleagues with the aim of securing high quality teaching for children with SEN.

In some schools, the SENCo may also be known as the Inclusion Manager.

The key responsibilities of the SENCo include:

- Liaising with and advising fellow teachers
- > Co-ordinating provision for pupils with SEN
- Overseeing the records of all pupils with SEN
- Liaising with parents of pupils with SEN
- > Contributing to the in service training of staff
- Liaising with external agencies including the Local Authority's support and educational psychology services, the youth support services, health and social care and voluntary bodies.

We hope to see many parent carers at our first parent carer forum on 5th December 2014 at Lindfield Primary School. Sarah Kelly, Speech and Language Therapist, will be talking about strategies to help you improve your child's ability to listen both in the school setting and at home. This will be a lively, interactive session and you should go away with lots of tips to try out at home. There will be plenty of time for networking and discussion, coffee and mince pies and a chance for you to tell us what you would like future forums to look like and what topics you would like featured. 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Employing professionals project launches

We are delighted that Emma Bannister, family and child support worker, Jane Divall, Play Therapist, and Sarah Kelly, Speech and Language Therapist, have joined ASCEND. The team is helping us to provide better and timelier intervention for those children that need it.

There are clear guidelines and referral criteria available and these can be found on the website, www.ascendhub.co.uk

So far we have received over 20 referrals and we have been able to respond to these within 4 weeks.

Sarah Kelly said, "I've really been enjoying visiting all of the schools and meeting everyone. I'm excited about the opportunity to work closely with the children and to be able to offer direct intervention."

The intervention is being welcomed by schools. Shirley Gardner, Assistant Headteacher (Inclusion) at Warden Park Primary Academy, said, "The ability to refer to the Ascend programme has improved the opportunities for support for our children. The referral process is quick and easy and the response from the therapists has been swift and encouraging."

Rob Long behaviour workshops

In July we invited Rob Long to run some workshops for staff and parents to help develop skills to address low level behavioural problems, both at home and in the classroom.

Rob is a well-established and dynamic presenter and 98% of participants reported that they had found the workshop useful.

All staff that attended went away at the end of the day with an action plan to support at least one child within their school. Follow up evaluations will be carried out this term to track how those action plans have been implemented.
