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The staff and I would like to wish all parents and children a very Happy New Year! Already, we have been back in school for two and a half weeks and life here at school has been very exciting!

**Drop off & Pick Up Times** - Some of our parents/carers and children are entering and exiting via the vehicle entrances and there have been reports of cars having to brake suddenly to avoid hitting children running unsupervised. Therefore, to keep our children safe and drivers from worrying about hitting pedestrians, please can all pedestrians enter and exit school via the 'field' gate by the scooter pods at "drop off" and "pick up" times. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

**Mornings** - Please may I respectfully remind parents that teachers are unable to talk to them about their child in the mornings, other than a very quick message e.g. who is picking up their child that day. At 8.45 the doors open, and the teacher's responsibilities must be focused on the children and their safety. If you need to speak to your child's teacher urgently, please come to the school office before 8.35am. Teachers are always happy to phone a parent at lunchtime or make an appointment for after school.

**Small change** – We would like to support Holy Trinity Church in collecting small loose change. The money raised will go to support children in Africa by buying chickens for them to rear and then sell the eggs, so they can raise funds to go to school. If you would like to support this charity, please bring in your change between **Monday 22**<sup>nd</sup> **January & Friday 26th January**; there will be a container in the central foyer by the library.

Wellies – We would also like to support a local charity taking wellies out for the Syrian refugee children, who are forced to live in refugee camps. Again, we will be collecting the wellies between Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> January & Friday 26th January. If you have any spare wellies your child has outgrown, please put them in the box under the canopy by the field door and we will make sure they are sent to the charity.

**Year 2 SATs Meeting** – Ms Dobson and Miss Rap will be holding a Year 2 SATs meeting on Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> January at 3.30pm in Hawthorn classroom. During this meeting they will be explaining what the children will be doing this year in their SATs.

**Reading Meeting** - We will be holding a meeting on Reading Strategies to develop inference, deduction and questioning to stretch more fluent readers on **Thursday 1**<sup>st</sup> **February at 6.00pm** in the hall. When children are reading fluently, it is still important for them to read aloud to an adult, but for the focus to change from the segmenting of words to being able to understand the text, including finding answers to questions where the clue isn't implicit in the text, or finding phrases from the text in answer to a specific question. This meeting is particularly beneficial for parents with children in Years 2 – 6, but parents with children in other Year groups are also welcome to attend.

**PTA Race Night** – Our PTA are currently selling tickets to the Race Night, which is being held on Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> February in the Queen's Hall. Please see Nikki Mortimer or Karen Ford to purchase your tickets. Your support with these events means our PTA can buy valuable resources for our children to use and enjoy.
