

GROUNDS TEAM NEWS – Spring 2019

The Grounds Team is a sub-group of your PTA and our main aim is to help support the teachers to use the school grounds as a learning environment. West Sussex Council maintain the school playing fields, however it is the school's responsibility to fund the maintenance of additional areas, such as the mud kitchen, sensory garden, story oak, forest school area, woodland, open grassland, pond and stream. Much of this maintenance is carried out by volunteers on our Grounds Days. Your PTA also funds a regular gardener to keep the path access through the woods clear, cut the willow/hedges and keep some of the blackthorn under control!

What have we been up to?

During our Grounds Day in early March we:

- filled the planters outside the Year 2 classrooms (donated by Year 6 Leavers 2018)
- carried out maintenance work around the pond
- installed the base for the greenhouse
- built some outside storage
- refurbished some raised beds
- put up the polytunnel for the gardening club

Children remain the responsibility of their grown-ups on Grounds Days. These days are a fantastic opportunity for children to explore the grounds - they're welcome to bring bikes/scooters to use on the playgrounds, build dens in the woods, play in the mud kitchen, explore the undergrowth or even help out with some tasks! Of course, we always finish our grounds days with a campfire and toasting marshmallows!

Later in March we ran a stall at the Cuckfield Local Market, where we sold many plants and children decorated pond-themed biscuits. This raised £144 to go towards the renovation of the school pond (see below) and was a great opportunity to talk to the local community about the school grounds.





What's happening in the grounds now?

Too much wildlife for one pond!!

Springtime is an active time in the grounds - especially in the pond. Earlier this term we were fortunate to see 11 toads all in one go and 20 newts! Can you spot the toad spawn in the picture below? Toads lay their spawn in long strings unlike frogs spawn, which is laid in clumps. The pond is home to lots of other wildlife too, including horse leeches and dragonfly larvae as well as other invertebrate life. Can we find 100 different species within a year?

Have you noticed the new fencing around the pond?

Previously there wasn't quite enough room for a class to get around the pond safely - we would love more children to be able to explore this aquatic habitat. Your PTA have helped fund a new fence around a larger area and a pond dipping platform will be installed shortly. We're also thankful for some additional funding from Cuckfield Local and are currently applying for funding to be able to extend this area further — to add an additional smaller pond, planting, a raised walkway and a boardwalk, to be able to provide sustainable access to the area.
