Dear Parents / Carers,

As we enter the second half of Autumn term, it has been wonderful to reflect on what has been such a positive and productive start to the school year. Our new Reception children have settled in beautifully – full of enthusiasm, curiosity and confidence as they explore their new routines and make new friends. We are so proud of how well they have adapted to school life. Across the school, visitors have remarked on the calm, purposeful atmosphere in classrooms and the clear sense of focus and enjoyment in learning. It has been a pleasure to see pupils collaborating thoughtfully, showing kindness to one another and living out our school values. It has also been a busy half term beyond the classroom, with a wide range of trips, workshops, and enrichment activities bringing our curriculum to life and providing memorable experiences for all year groups.

We were delighted to welcome our School Improvement Partner, Dr Justin Smith, for his termly monitoring visit this month. Dr Smith, who monitors all HET schools, focused on our Quality of Teaching. His report was extremely positive and praised many aspects of school life at Holy Trinity. He noted that "the quality of teaching throughout Holy Trinity is a strength" and that in Reception "pupils receive an excellent introduction to life at the school," where "expectations are high and children are surrounded by many opportunities to learn." He described phonics teaching as being "at a high level" and was impressed that "the outdoor learning environment mirrored the expectations within the classroom." Further up the school, he recognised that "pupils are exposed to a broad range of curriculum activity" and that "very high quality teaching ensures pupils continue to receive an excellent standard of primary education." In Year 6, he praised "the very high quality behaviour for learning," describing it as "a testament to how pupils develop holistically as they move up through the school." He also commended the school's commitment to reading, stating that "the Reading Challenge has been embraced passionately," and that the use of "individual pupil passports and additional funding should have a significant impact on pupils' breadth of reading experience." We are extremely proud that Dr Smith's report reflects the dedication, skill and hard work of our entire team.

What have we been up to?

Reception children had a visit from the Fire Service. Year 1 visited Tilgate Park, Year 2 travelled to Ashdown Forest, Year 3 visited Butser Farm, Year 4 went to the British Wildlife Trust Centre, Year 5 visited Chichester planetarium and Year 6 children had the Hands on History experts, teaching them about life during World War 1.

"We went to Buster Farm to see a Stone Age village. Whilst there we enriched our learning by seeing their settlements, carried out some archaeological excavations where we found lots of bones and pottery fragments. We also had fun trying our hand at colouring and carving in chalk and making our own pots out of clay just like people in the Stone Age did. It was a fantastic day and the children impressed out workshop leaders with all their knowledge."
